ATTENDANCE - LEAVE OF ABSENCE/ HOLIDAY REQUESTS

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

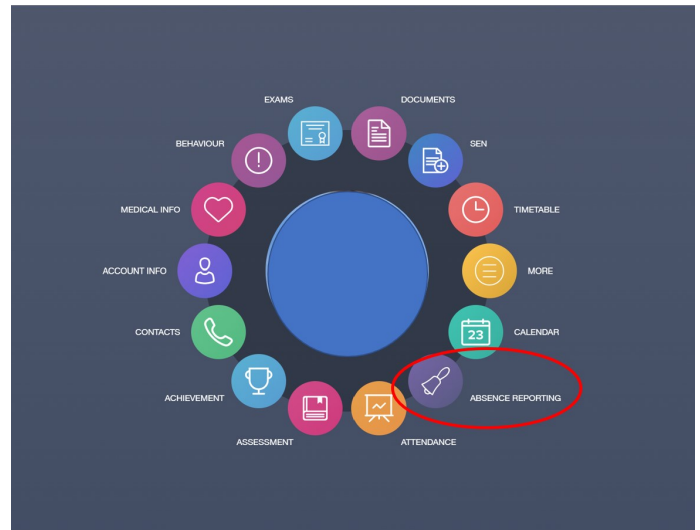
ABSENCE REPORTING VIA EDULINK

Dear Parent/Carer

This is just a reminder that all absences should now be reported via Edulink.

When you log into Edulink you will be able to see a new icon shaped like a bell (Absence Reporting) as per the image to the right.

When you click on this you will be taken to a page where absences are reported (Image 2). Your child's name and photo will appear where the blue box sits in the image below.



- ◆ For illness we ask that you only report one day at a time on the day of absence.
- ◆ However, you will be able to report an absence for medical appointments, etc. in advance.
- ◆ Holiday requests should still be requested via our Leave of Absence form that can be collected from any reception and is also available on Edulink (Noticeboard, Forms).
- ◆ Select date From* and To*
- ◆ Insert Reason for Absence*. Please do not state unwell or illness. **Please specify details of the issue as you would have done via our previous recorded telephone calls** (example in Image 2).



Should we not receive a communication from you we will send an absence call/message – normally around 10.00am. We do expect parents to respond to this for safeguarding reasons.

Correspondence

Wednesday is Letter Day. Letters for all students, as well as those addressed to specific Year Groups, are emailed to parents and uploaded on to Edulink One.

The College also produces a regular Newsletter which contains articles from students, information on forthcoming events, reports on weekly events, etc. This is also uploaded on to Edulink One.

If any parent does not have access to the internet, they should contact the College to request a hard copy.

Lost Property

All property brought into College should be clearly marked with the students' name. Any items found are generally handed in to receptions. If the item is named, a message will be passed to the Form Tutor asking the student to go to reception to collect their property. Students may make their own enquiries at reception if they mislay any items.

Rewards and Sanctions System

Students meeting the College's high standards are rewarded accordingly. Praise Points (Achievement Points) are allocated via Edulink One for contributions to Collingwood and more specifically for individual effort in the various aspects of College life.

For full details please refer to the Management of Behaviour Policy, available to view on Edulink (Noticeboard, College Policies).

Use of Mobile Phones by Students

Students are allowed to bring a mobile to College. However:

- ◆ This is done so at their own risk
- ◆ Use of social media during the College Day should not occur.
- ◆ Phones are not to be seen or used inside the buildings during the day, unless instructed to do so by a member of staff
- ◆ Students in Years 7, and 8 are not allowed to use their mobile phone at all during the College day.
- ◆ Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 are permitted to use their mobile phone at break and at lunch in their social areas although students are educated on the use of social media at these times. Times when this is not permitted may occur through a collective misuse.
- ◆ No students should be using their phones on walkways during the College day.
- ◆ At no stage should any student video or take photos of another member of the College community without their permission. Posting of any of these is forbidden, and sanctions will be issued
- ◆ Phones are permitted or not so, at the discretion of the trip leader on trips and residential trips.

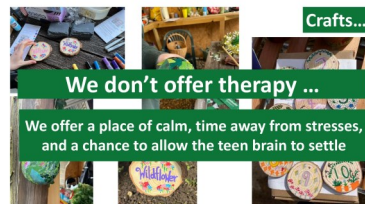

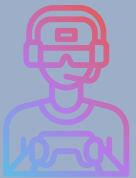
