As you may be aware, we are your **Mental Health Support Team (MHST)** and we are based across a selection of Primary and Secondary schools in



Surrey Heath. We work for Surrey and Borders Partnership Trust (SABP) within Mindworks – the new name for Surrey's emotional wellbeing and mental health service for children and young people.


There is a known correlation between attainment and mental health, and we work within your school to offer additional support with the care and pastoral need that goes alongside education. We support children and young people's emotional and mental health and hope to provide early intervention to prevent difficulties from becoming a problem and to reduce their impact on daily life.

Our aim is to work alongside Surrey Heath schools to implement a whole-school approach to mental health and well-being. In order to do this, we are completing a **Whole School Audit** and want to hear your views regarding what existing mental health support is available, as well as learn what provisions the school community would like in place. **The views of children, parents and staff at your school are fundamental to the work we are doing**.

ATTENDANCE - LEAVE OF ABSENCE/ HOLIDAY REQUESTS

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.






