COLLINGWOOD STUDENTS VISIT HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT

Following an invitation from our local MP, Dr Al Pinkerton, several students (including ourselves) from both the student leadership teams and the College's debating team, had the opportunity to visit the Houses of Parliament.

When we arrived, we were able to view the grand Westminster Hall before meeting our guide, Ruby. We then had the pleasure of spending the next two hours getting an in-depth, highly informative tour of the building, including both the Houses of Commons and Lords, and various lobbies. On our tour we learnt about the history of the building itself, alongside the story behind its grand architecture, meanwhile gaining an invaluable education on the history of democracy within our country. Being within Westminster allowed us to see where important events took place, like the origins of the English Civil War under Charles I and thus learn about the explanations behind certain traditions still practised to this day.

EXAM CERTIFICATES

Exam certificate postage payment is available on ParentPay. Please ensure payment is made as soon as possible to ensure your child receives their exam certificates for the Summer 2025 season. This is of particular importance for those students in Years 11 and 13 who are leaving the College.

To avoid certificates being lost in transit or left crumpled at the bottom of a school bag, we encourage payment to be made for Years 9 and 10 too.

For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you don't have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results, but it is very costly.



Jordan first gained his taste of the workplace when he was supported by Employability Services to undertake a Supported Internship as part of his final year at college.

Jordan's hard work was rewarded post college with the offer of paid employment, and this is where he still remains today. All this was possible due to the very supportive nature of his managers who say "Jordan is still learning to be more socially interactive with customers and colleagues and able to do his selected tasks to a high standard as well as assess when something needs doing without prompts".


