YEAR 10 STUDENTS VISIT THE UNIVERSITY OF SURREY

"The taster lessons were very useful/relevant but also really interesting. The tour was useful to understand what student life could be like." On Wednesday 19 June a group of Year 10 students had the pleasure of visiting the University of Surrey to gain an insight into what Higher Education was like.

They departed for Guildford at 9.15am and were greeted at the campus by some of the Student Ambassadors. They were then taken to a very modern classroom to be welcomed and an introduction of the day was given.

The first session was all about Information, advice and guidance of being a student. They learnt about the different types of university, the financial side of studying and all the things that they could expect if they went to university.

"Got to know more about cost and student life and all the opportunities I could have." This was followed by a Sociolinguistics session in a Lecture Theatre by a Doctor of Languages at the University. She talked about 'contact' languages and how they have changed over time. Our students seemed fascinated by the lesson and really engaged with the questions that were given.

Next it was lunch time where the students were given a packed lunch and ate the food in one of the many eateries at the University.

"I now feel more knowledgeable about uni life." Following lunch, the students got some fresh air and were taken on a campus tour. They visited many different buildings including the huge library, the Students Union and the many different study rooms.

EXAM CERTIFICATES

Exam certificate postage payment is available on ParentPay. Please ensure payment is made as soon as possible to ensure your child receives their exam certificates for the summer 2024 season. This is of particular importance for those students in Years 11 and 13 who are leaving the College.

To avoid certificates being lost in transit or left crumpled at the bottom of a school bag, we encourage payment to be made for Years 9 and 10 too.

For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you do not have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results but it is very costly.

Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.


